

HEALTH CARE INFORMATION & STUDENT INSURANCE

Student Health Services Include:

1. **Diagnosis and treatment of short-term medical problems.**
2. **Emergency and first aid treatment.**
3. **Counseling and referrals:**
 - a. Male/Female Wellness Examination
 - b. Nutrition Counseling
 - c. Any health related problems, and irregular laboratory results.
4. **Immunizations:**
 - a. Diphtheria—Tetanus (chargeable immunization)
 - b. Recombivax: Hepatitis B (chargeable immunization)
5. **Screening and testing:**
 - a. Hearing and vision
 - b. Blood pressure
 - c. Tuberculosis skin test
 - d. Laboratory tests, including Pap smear (special low lab cost)
6. **Student Health Services Office:**

The Health Services Office is staffed by a full-time nurse during the day and part-time nurses in the evening. A nurse is on duty Monday through Thursday from 8:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m., and Friday 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. A physician and nurse practitioner is present 20 hours per week in the Health Services Office each week except for Friday. All registered credit students may consult him/her for medical care. There are charges for physical examinations, lab studies, some immunizations and women/men health physicals. Medications are stocked and dispensed at minimal cost.

During the summer session there is a nurse on duty from 8:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. [Summer Session I and II] and 5:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m. [Summer Session I]. The same services are provided as in the regular school year, although for fewer hours per week. A physician is scheduled for 4 hours per week during the summer session and a nurse practitioner for 4-1/2 hours.

7. **Psychological Services**

A full-time psychologist is available to students. The office location is in the Student Health Center. The psychologist's office is open: Monday, Wednesday, and Friday 9 am to 5 pm, Tuesday, 1 pm to 7 pm, and Thursday 9 am to 1 pm.

The Blanket Accident Policy provided to all students provides an aggregate maximum coverage paid for any one accident of \$10,000 to student injured under the following circumstances and requirements:

1. An accident on campus; and
2. While attending or participating in a regularly scheduled school activity approved and supervised by proper college personnel. Individual, unsupervised and unscheduled activities are not covered.
3. While traveling to and from such scheduled activity as described in No. 2, providing students are traveling as a group. Individual travel is not covered.
4. Accident reports must be filed with the Health Services Office and insurance claim forms signed by the injured student in order to initiate the claims process.
5. The Blanket Accident Policy contains a non-duplication of benefit provisions. This means that claims must be submitted to students' private insurance carriers for payment before college policy will apply.
