Students will demonstrate these abilities in advanced composition as they research and write a series of argumentative essays, which demonstrate the ability to analyze issues, evaluate positions, and argue persuasively through clear, concise prose.

This advanced composition course is open to all students who have successfully completed English 101 and is designed for those who expect to transfer to four-year colleges or universities. Students will read and write extensively, while applying critical thinking skills and research techniques. Students will demonstrate these abilities in advanced composition as they research and write a series of argumentative essays, which demonstrate the ability to analyze issues, evaluate positions, and argue persuasively through clear, concise prose.

This Honors section is open to all students who have completed English 101 with a grade of "C" or better. Students will be expected to analyze issues in more depth and write on them at greater length than they would in a non-honors section. Honors section requirements: Continuing students, successful completion of English 101. Beginning students are not eligible to take English 201H.

Students who want to register for ESL 027, ESL 197, or ESL 198 should be aware that, if they have not met the prerequisite, they will be informed that they are not allowed to register in these courses (the course is blocked). Students who may register for these courses include the following:

- Students currently enrolled in the previous courses (ESL 010, ESL 027, or ESL 197). You will be allowed to enroll in the next level course pending a final grade of "CR" (Credit). Talk to your instructor before you enroll.
- Students who have placed into ESL 027, ESL 197, or ESL 198 through the Rio Hondo assessment process.
- Students who have completed the previous course with a grade of "CR" or passed the Rio Hondo ESL Common Final.

The following students should bring assessment results, grade reports, and/or transcripts with them to see a counselor, Admissions and Records staff, or the Dean of Communications & Languages in A219 at 562-908-3429:

- Students who have completed the equivalent previous ESL course at another college or university.

**ESL 010 (FORMERLY ESL 036)**

**ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE**

3 Units/Prerequisite: Appropriate placement through the Rio Hondo assessment process.

This course is designed to help limited English-speaking students communicate better in English. The course focuses on the development of both verbal and written skills. Topics specifically emphasized are pronunciation, conversation, idiomatic expressions, listening, vocabulary, reading, and writing. These are taught at an entry level. This course is offered on a credit/no credit basis and is not applicable to the degree. One hour of language lab per week to be arranged.

COMPOSITION**

This is a beginning composition class for second language students focusing on the fundamentals of academic writing in English. Basic sentence structures, paragraph development, composition forms, English grammar, and word usage are studied in various rhetorical modes. This is a non-degree credit course, will be offered on a pass/no pass basis, and is not applicable to the degree. The class includes one hour of language lab per week to be arranged.

This course presents a multi-skills approach to English grammar and sentence structure for second-language students. Through reading, writing, listening, and related activities such as dictation, cloze exercises, and sentence analysis, students practice the elements of correct English while focusing on verbs and verb forms. This is a non-degree applicable course and is taken on a credit/no credit basis. One hour of language lab per week to be arranged.

**Transfers to:** *UC, CSU*

A continuation of ESL 027, this course is for ESL students and emphasizes longer writings with more complicated sentence patterns, leading up to a basic essay. Students focus on both thematic and rhetorical modes of composition while they practice topic sentences, thesis statements, subordination, and transitional expressions. This course is offered on a credit/no credit basis. The class includes one hour of language lab per week.

As a result of taking this course, students will be able to utilize various stages of the writing process, MLA conventions of academic writing in several rhetorical modes (including a research paper), and advanced levels of grammatical and mechanical accuracy in their writing. The class includes one hour of language lab per week.

**1 Unit each module/Prerequisite:** *Appropriate placement through the Rio Hondo assessment process.*

**Advisory:** *ESL 027 or appropriate assessment.*

This is a three-part computer-based skills course for students who have difficulty with verb tenses and forms. Initial placement in one of the three modules is based on the students' English Placement Test ratings. In the Language and ESL Lab, students progress through the separate grammar modules at their own pace, from basic to advanced concepts and exercises. Using reading, writing, and listening skills, they practice the elements of correct English while focusing on verbs and verb forms. This is a non-degree applicable course and is taken on a credit/no credit basis.
