NURSE ASSISTANT PRE-CERTIFICATION TRAINING COURSE

4 Unites/Advisory: READ 023 or appropriate assessment; ENGL 035 or ESL 198 or appropriate assessment MATH 020 or appropriate assessment.

This course is designed for students who have expressed an interest in an entry level nursing course. This course meets Title 22 regulations for taking care of the geriatric population in a long term care setting utilizing skills in basic care, emergency care and communication. The Nurse assistant Pre-Certification Training course consists of a combination of 64 hours classroom instruction and 128 hours supervised clinical practice in long term facilities. This course prepares the student to take state certification exam to be a certified nurse assistant (CNA). After obtaining the state certification, the student may find employment in the acute care, long term care or assisted living settings. This course may be taken once and repeated for credit.

HOME HEALTH AIDE COURSE

2 Unites/Advisory: READ 023 or appropriate assessment; ENGL 035 or ESL 198 or appropriate assessment MATH 020 or appropriate assessment.

This course is designed for students who are Certified Nurse Assistants that wish to learn how to provide personal care in the home care setting for those who are unable to do it for themselves and/or promote the recovery, safety and comfort of the patient. Additional emphasis on rehabilitative nursing care, family relationships and the impact of long-term illness on the family as well as the client will be included. The Home Health Aide training courses consists of a combination of 24 hours classroom instruction and 48 hours supervised clinical practice in the Assisted Living setting. This course meets title 22 regulations for Home Health Aides training programs. This course may be taken once and repeated one time for credit.
