PHY 150

GENERAL PHYSICS-I

4 Units/Prerequisite: MATH 175 with a grade of "C" or better or appropriate assessment.

Advisory: ENGL 035 or ESL 198 or appropriate assessment and READ 023 or appropriate assessment.

Transfers to: UC (credit limit*), CSU (*Students will receive credit from UC for one physics series: PHY 150 and PHY 160 or PHY 211, PHY 212 and PHY 213)

This course is the first of a two-semester sequence and is designed for students transferring to a four-year institution and planning careers in health professional fields such as medicine, dentistry, veterinary science, pharmacy, and optometry as well as those students in engineering technology and architecture. Students majoring in the biological sciences should consult a counselor as to whether this course satisfies the general preparation requirements for the major at the university. Topics include kinematics, dynamics, energy, work, momentum, and conservation principles.

PAC 040
BASIC POLICE RECRUIT CLASS

24 Units / Prerequisite: A California Department of Justice clearance for firearms training; a Physical Examination; PAC 43.48L or equivalent. Advisory: READ 023 or appropriate assessment and ENGL 035 or ESL 198 or appropriate assessment; successful completion of the POST Entry Level Test Battery.

This is a fundamental course which covers criminal law, evidence, procedure and investigation, firearms, first aid, defense tactics, use of chemical agents and other related police subjects. This course meets the educational requirement for basic certification by the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (P.O.S.T.). This course may not be repeated. All sections of PAC 040 Basic Police Recruit Class have a materials fee of \$530.00 per ticket number.

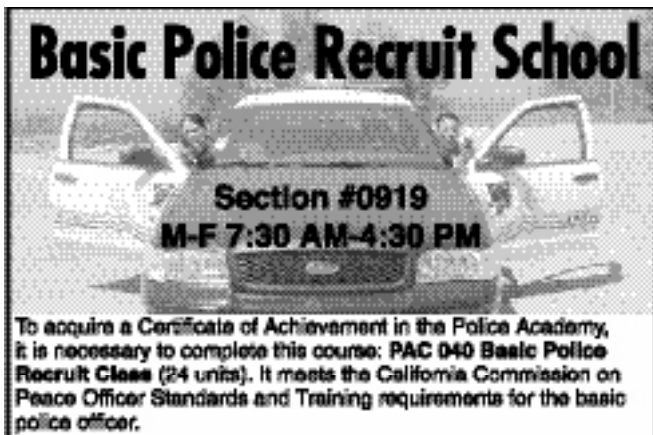

EXTENDED/RESERVE MODULAR FORMAT ACADEMY

Classes for the Extended/Reserve Academy will meet on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evenings from 6:00PM until 11:00PM and on alternate Sundays from 7:00AM until 4:30PM.

The course is divided into 3 modules to accommodate training for the different levels of police reserves. The entry level is a 162 hour block which when completed, qualifies a person as a Level III police reserve. The next level is a 228 hour block which when completed, qualifies a person as a Level II police reserve. The final level is a 428 hour block which when completed, qualifies a person as a Level I police reserve AND as a full time sworn police officer. A student can exit the program at the end of any level, depending on the amount of training desired. Orientation for the January 2010 Academy will be held on 11/10/09 at 6:00pm.

BASIC COURSE REQUALIFICATION

The Basic Course Requalification Program consists of 136 hours of instruction designed to meet the requirements for a California Peace Officer or Level I Reserve to return to the field of Law Enforcement after a 3 year or more break in service.

GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES

3 Units/Advisory: ENGL 035 or ESL 198 or appropriate assessment, READ 023 or appropriate assessment.

Transfers to: UC (credit limit*), CSU

(*Students will receive credit from UC for only one of the following courses: POLYS 110 or POLYS 110H)

This course surveys and analyzes the origins, principles, institutions, policies, and politics of U.S. National and California State Governments, including their constitutions. Emphasis is placed on the rights and responsibilities of citizens, and an understanding of the political processes and issues involved in the workings of government. This course fulfills the American Institutions requirement for the Associate Degree. It also is suitable for students wishing to expand their knowledge of local, state and national governments.
