



HOW DO I GET CERTIFIED FOR VA EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS

Starting your benefits.	You must complete necessary forms in VA center and attend mandatory orientation
CEO/Forms	You must have letter of eligibility or Enrollment Status page from eBenefits
Counseling Meeting	You must meet with VA counselor-twice. First time for Abbreviated Educational Plan and again for Comprehensive Educational Plan
Yellow Card	You must complete and submit a "yellow card" to the VA Center. Without this card being submitted you will not be certified.
GPA	You must be enrolled in classes and maintain satisfactory progress (2.0 GPA)
GPA Reporting to VA	You must be enrolled in classes and maintain satisfactory progress (2.0 GPA) Reporting to VA any drops within semester and after semester.

You must have at least one on campus class to receive full housing benefits otherwise you will only receive the national average for housing.



If you are a Chapter 33 (post 9-11) and you want to receive housing benefits, you must be enrolled in at least 6.5 units. If you are enrolled in less than 12 units your benefits will be adjusted accordingly

DSP & S and Veterans Services

Services for Injured Veterans-

Student Veterans, especially those who served in combat zones, can experience a variety of difficulties when attending college due to injuries suffered during their service. Veterans may experience problems accessing and participating fully in their education due to several "signature" injuries: Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI), Post-traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), and Hearing Loss, are just a few recognized barriers that Veterans face when pursuing a higher education.

Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI):

A traumatic brain injury involves injury to the brain as the result of trauma, and can result in loss of some previously learned skills or knowledge, and create difficulties with new learning. There can be physical, sensory, cognitive, language, behavioral and /or emotional changes as a result of the injury.

Educational Limitations:

Injuries to the brain can result in a wide variety of types and severities of limitations including, but not limited to the following:

- Reduced attention skills, including increased distractibility, which may interfere with learning and performance on tests
- Reduced memory skills, especially for new information
- Slower retrieval of learned information
- Slowed or reduced ability to form abstract concepts, or to express those concepts in words
- Cognitive difficulty may cause more rapid fatigue than expected in tests
- Sensory difficulties may interfere with hearing and/or visual perception

Potential Accommodations:

- Notetaker or audio taping of lectures
- Preferential seating
- Alternate media or reader
- Extended time for exams
- Distraction-reduced exam area
- Breaks during exams

Hearing Loss:

Hearing loss may range from complete deafness to a slight loss in a few frequencies and may include tinnitus.

Educational Limitations:

- Difficulty hearing lectures, group discussions, or student questions in a classroom setting
- Difficulty taking notes while trying to listen
- Difficulty hearing audio in media presentations
- May misunderstand auditory information without realizing the error

Potential Accommodations:

- Preferential seating
- Notetaker for class lectures
- Assistive listening device

Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD):

Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) is an anxiety disorder that can develop after exposure to a terrifying event in which grave physical harm occurred or was threatened. Symptoms may include: frightening thoughts/memories, sleep problems, feeling detached, being easily startled.

Educational Limitations:

- Difficulty processing lectures and taking notes simultaneously in the classroom
- Difficulty taking tests in standard conditions
- Difficulty concentrating and staying focused
- Low tolerance for stressful situations
- Difficulty managing emotions in anxiety-producing or novel situations

Potential Accommodations:

- Extended time for exams
- Distraction reduced exam area
- Preferential Seating

If you are experiencing any of the above, please visit the DSP&S department for an evaluation. DSP&S is located in the Student Services Building Room SS330

Additional Useful Information

Declaring a Major-You must declare a major or transfer goal, and continue to make satisfactory progress toward completion of your educational goal. If satisfactory progress is not maintained, the school may place you on probation and the VA will be informed of your progress status.

Educational Plan – You must obtain an comprehensive educational plan from the Veteran Counselor in order to continue with your benefits.

Changing Majors/School – If you decide to change your major you must meet with the Veteran Counselor and change your Educational Plan with your Counselor's approval. If you are changing schools, you must complete a change of program and or place of training form, VA Form 22-1995 (available online at <u>www.ebenefits.va.gov</u>).

Every Semester – After registering you must fill out a yellow card located online at the Rio Hondo Veteran website and in the VSC. If you do not submit a yellow card, you will not be certified.

Course Applicability — You must have a current and completed educational plan on file with the VSC at all times. Only REQUIRED courses that satisfy requirements outlined by your Educational Plan can be certified for VA purposes. Courses not on your Educational Plan cannot be certified.

Incomplete Courses – If you receive an incomplete grade in an approved course in which you're receiving VA benefits, you must complete the required coursework within one year. If you do not complete this coursework you will receive a grade as agreed to by the instructor, which may result in an overpayment.

No Credit and Withdrawals – You may be required to reimburse the VA for any money received for a "No Credit" or "W" that is issued. You must immediately notify the VSC or any change in units. If the VA is not notified promptly of your withdrawal, an overpayment may results.

Punitive Grades- If you receive a punitive grade (F), in a course that you are reciving benefits for, and you did not attend throughout the entire semester, did not drop the course in a timely manner, or did not complete the final, you will be liable for any over payments.

Change of Address or Telephone Number – It is your responsibility to immediately notify VSC and Admissions and Records Office if you change your address and/or telephone number.

Email- Correspondence and announcements will be sent to your personal email. It is your responsibility to check your email regularly and to inform the VSC immediately if you change your email address.



VETERAN STUDENT ACADEMIC PROGRESS REQUIREMENTS

Veterans and dependents are required to comply with Veteran Regulations Sections 21.4135, 21.4235 and 21.4277 in regard to required attendance and progress that the student veteran or dependent must meet in order to receive educational benefit under Title 38, United States Code.

To prevent possible future interruption or termination of educational benefits, please note the following:

- All Veteran and eligible dependent students are required to maintain satisfactory attendance and academic progress toward their stated academic goal.
- The veteran's Administration has determined that satisfactory academic progress of veterans or eligible dependents is measured by successfully completing each semester with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0.
- Grades from other schools which are used toward a current goal may be considered in the grade point average calculation.
- Should a veteran or eligible dependent fail to maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 for two consecutive semesters, the Veteran must present mitigating circumstances to the RHC Veteran Service Center and one additional semester (3rd semester) of educational benefits may be allowed if: 1) The Veteran meets with an academic counselor (to complete a Veterans Petition for 3rd Semester Certification), and 2) The Veteran fully intends to bring the "cumulative" GPA up to a minimum of 2.0 by the end of that 3rd semester.
- Upon satisfactory completion of approved courses at the end of the 3rd semester (WHEN THE CUMULATIVE GPA REACHES A MINIMUM OF 2.0), the Veteran student will be considered maintaining satisfactory academic progress, and certification continues.
- If the cumulative grade point average does not reach a minimum 2.0 at the conclusion of that 3rd semester, the Veterans Service Center will be required to report the student to the VA as terminated for unsatisfactory progress, effective at the end of the 3rd semester.
- As a result of the termination, the RHC Veterans Service Center will not be able to certify the veteran for a 4th semester.
- The veteran or dependent has the responsibility to adhere to these standards of attendance and progress and to notify the Rio Hondo College Veterans Service Center of any changes in status that would affect the collecting of veteran's benefits.

Attendance/Changes to Enrollment:

• Class additions, drops, withdrawals and last day of attendance must be reported at once to the Rio Hondo College Veterans Service Center.

Steps to Start your VA Educational Benefits

STEP 1

- Apply to Rio Hondo College
- Make appointment to take Assessment Test (if necessary)
- Apply for GI Bill
- Order ALL educational (including Military) transcripts to be sent directly to Admissions and Records department. Once Transcripts are at Rio Hondo, proceed to Step 2

*** Please Note- If you want priority registration with or without VA Ed Benefits, you MUST bring a copy of your DD214 to the VA Center so we can designate your veteran status.

STEP 2

- Make appointment to meet with Veteran Counselor
- Bring copy of DD214 and Letter of Eligibility
- Complete Intake Form
- Fill out yellow card, if you intend to be certified for current semester
- Attend a New Veteran Student Orientation

Steps to Continue to Receive your VA Educational Benefits

Step 1

 Submit a WIP on required dates. These dates are posted on our website, our office and on the TV monitor in halls. Drop WIP in designated basket located in the Veteran Center.

Step 2

- If you change a class, drop a class or want to be certified for a class you MUST turn in yellow card which is found in the Veteran Center's office and drop in the designated basket. This must be done EVERY semester you would like to be certified. Failure to do this may result in overpayment, non-payment or non-certification.
 - If you would like to change your major, you MUST meet with VA counselor.

Step 3

You must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better and complete the classes you enroll in with an acceptable grade. If you are falling below this requirement, please make appointment with counselor to discuss options.



- Apply to Rio Hondo College at <u>www.riohondo.edu</u>. Go to "Get Started" to complete RHC application and CCCApply. Apply for the semester that you plan on attending.
- Apply for your G.I. Educational Benefits at <u>www.ebenefits.va.gov</u>. Your Letter of Eligibility should be mailed to you within 2-4 weeks. Once received, bring a copy to the Veterans Service Center.
- Complete the FAFSA Application at <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u>.
 - Complete the Placement Tool online through your AccessRio Portal. Click on Academics (left side in gray area) then click on Placement Tool (bottom left side). This must be completed before scheduling an appointment with the VSC Counselor.
 - Intake Form (Veterans Service Center).
 - Copy of DD214 member #4 (the only one accepted)

Official transcripts must be ordered from all colleges, trade schools and any other schools you have previously attended, whether you received credit or not. Also your official military transcripts (JST) must be ordered as well.

Have transcripts mailed to: Rio Hondo College, 3600 Workman Mill Road, Whittier, CA 90601 Attention: Admissions & Records.

Suggestions on Maintaining Benefits

- In order to continue to be certified, you must submit a "yellow card" to our VSC, room SS150, at the beginning of **each semester** that you want to be certified.
- If there is a change in class schedule (i.e. you dropped a class, or changed a class) you must notify the VSC immediately by completing a "yellow card" or "pink card" if all classes are dropped.
