



lacebook, an american social média platform has changed its name to Heta, it was announced on Tuesday morning October 26 at the RecebookConnectioug mented. It was also announced at a virtual reality conference. while they were reflecting the company's ambitions growing beyond social media. According to CNBC, therebranding also comes after the company has dealt with many new reports over the past month stemming from whistleblower frances Raughn'strove of internal docu ments

Frances Raughn, a former ex employee, leaked a series of documents which induded

many stories that followed from The Wall Street Journal and otherpublications. One story that was notable was a story that showed the company knew instagram was detrimental to teenagers' mental health and was doing little about according to the article Facebook docu ments showhow toxic insta gram is for teens, Wall Street atrogen lemuoL

"Hyviewis that what we are seeing is a coordinat. ed effort to selectively use lealed documents to paint a Selectore of our company." Zuckerbergsaid after the com pany's earnings. Some of the documents that were released showed that the number of teen usersof Facebook apps in the United States has dedined by 13% since 2019.

According to the Verse with a projected drop of about 46% over the next two years Bloomedberghad reported that facebook researchers found the company was not expecting people born anytime after 2000. Atleastuntil after they were around their mid twenties.


Pig Kidney Succesfully Transplanted Into Human

River's Voice



The River Deep Student Film Festival

The *River Deep Student Film Festival* is an annual two-day event showcasing the year's best films developed by Rio Hondo College students. Students enter their work into competition and from these films, finalists are selected. During the two-day event, finalists' films are screened, winners are announced, and prizes are awarded. Guest speakers from the film industry are invited to present during one of the days of the festival to discuss their own work and to talk about opportunities for up-and-coming filmmakers, followed by a Q&A session. *River Deep* was cofounded and is coordinated by Rio faculty members Tom Callinan and Sheila Lynch.

Requirements

The River Deep Student Film Festival is open to students currently enrolled at Rio Hondo College. Students must write, direct, shoot, and edit their own work, alone or in collaboration with other Rio Hondo College students; filmmakers may receive guidance and help from instructors and professionals. The primary work, however, must be performed by the students. Students may use actors of any age to play different roles.

There are no restrictions on the art form of your film. Films may be live action, animation, claymation, still photography or any combination. All films must include end-credits that acknowledge writer(s), director, performers, and member of the production crew, such as editors, cinematographers, camera operators, and so forth.

Selected entries will be showcased at the Rio Hondo College Writes of Spring festival in April.

- · Microshort Category (1-5 minutes in length) All genres accepted
- · Short Film Category (6-12 minutes in length) All genres accepted
