## Ahnut the Student Leadership Institute

The Student Leadership Institute (SLI) at Rio Hondo College is a non-credit certificate program in partnership with California State University, Fullerton (CSUF). SLI Students are required to attend a series of workshops which will earn them a leadership certificate from CSUF upon program completion. Workshops focus on developing necessary skills for effective leadership and overall character development. Participation in SLI is free of charge and open to all RHC students. There are no minimum requirements for units enrolled, grade point average, or prior leadership experience for program participation.

## Reasons to Join

As an SLI participant, you will:

- Acquire and develop the skills and awareness necessary to become an effective leader on campus, in your community, and in your career.
- Earn a leadership certificate signed by the • CSUF college president, a very marketable tool on your resume and on transfer applications.
- Learn the value of networking through program participation and interaction with fellow students, faculty, staff, and administration.
- Learn to communicate effectively with confidence and develop confidence in your abilities to explore challenging issues.
- Understand and develop an increased awareness of current leadership styles and issues of diversity.
- Develop life skills that are essential to achieving established goals and objectives.
- Be engaged in co-curricular activities that will augment academic learning.

## **Program Requirements**

Students must participate in three (3) SLI Conferences held throughout the academic year which will include ten (10) workshops and complete five (5) volunteer hours to complete the experiential learning component for a total of 15 SLI hours. The program is designed to be completed in one (1) academic year.

## **Experiential Component Policy**

#### Purpose:

The purpose of the Experiential Component is to integrate learning with hands-on experience. SLI Participants have the unique opportunity to take what they have learned in their workshops and apply that to real world experiences.

Student Leadership Institute participants must complete a minimum of 5 hours of active leadership experience. In addition to this, a 2 page paper reflecting on this experience is also required. Students will submit their experience for review to staff by submitting an Experiential Component Intent/Verification Form.

### The guidelines for the experience are as follows:

### **1. Experiential Component Intent**

- It is recommended that you meet one-on-one with staff in order to review your experiential component.

### 2. Activity / Event Requirements\*

- Minimum of five (5) hours of experience
- Utilize what you learned in your workshops
- Must be concurrent; activity must be at the same time as taking your SLI workshops
- Does not need to be affiliated with CSUF or Rio Hondo College , but should have a supervising professional to verify participation

#### 3. Experiential Component Paper\*

- No less than two (2) FULL pages
- Double-spaced
- Times New Roman font
- One (1) inch margins

#### -Paper should include:

- Brief description of the activity
- Explicit content connected to at least three workshops.
- How you have **APPLIED** the concepts learned to your experience.

#### 4. Experiential Component Verification

Have supervising professional sign form and attach to the experiential component paper

During the last conference in March, you will be given an opportunity to write your essay in a computer lab. Papers which do not meet all requirements, especially for the written paper—**part three of the requirements listed above**—will be sent back to the participant. The participant then needs to edit the paper as necessary and re-submit in order to attend the end-of-the-year Banquet and receive a Certificate of Completion.
