We currently offer more sports (8) for women than men (6). The numbers again this year are just outside being test 1 compliant, and our sport offerings have not changed. If women's wrestling is approved we are planning to offer the sport immediately if our budget can handle the additional costs. Looking at our data from our CCCApply survey, 471 males expressed interest in an athletic team compared to 271 females. Of the sports we do not offer the number one sport requested was football at 53 inquiries.

The high school data is overwhelming numbers in Track and Field for both women and men. Unfortunately we do not have the facility to practice on or host events. We have 6 lane track and no room or budget to expand or build event areas, we are located on a hill and flat ground is not easy to come by. We are also surrounded by schools with excellent track and field facilities (Citrus, Mt. SAC, Pasadena, ELAC, and Cerritos).

We will continue to try and expand our sport offerings and increase our female sport participants, without taking away from our male student athletes.
