However, a sUAV user must be FAA107 licensed for any direct or indirect commercial use of sUAS. This course is also intended to be part of the Certificate of Achievement in Geographic Information Systems.

HUSR 120: Introduction to Rehabilitation Services

(Behavioral and Social Science)

Degree Applicable; 3.0 Units

Justification: This class is designed to prepare the student to work

at a level of competency and understanding with persons with disabilities in the community. The student will develop an awareness of the social, psychological, economic, physical, medical, and environmental needs of people with disabilities as they seek vocational rehabilitation services. The student preparing for the degree in rehabilitation services should be able to provide services for people with disability, evaluate assistive technology, apply basic counseling techniques, and conduct and evaluate basic research. The class introduces students who seek to transfer to a four-year institution and work in the field of rehabilitation services. This course will maximize individual strengths in their work with people with disabilities, and emphasize individual choice in the planning process. This course will be submitted for articulation to CSU Los Angeles for their COUN 2000 course for their Bachelor of Science in Rehabilitation Services Program. In addition, it will be added to the Drug Studies Associate of Science Degree & the Certificate of Achievement.

- Nursing students who have already earned a baccalaureate or higher degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher learning are not required to complete any general education requirements. Instead, these students only need to complete the coursework necessary for licensing as a registered nurse.

The loan assumption agreement will be considered no longer effective and deemed terminated if a program participant fails to complete a minimum of three academic years of teaching on a full-time basis or the equivalent on a part-time basis undergraduate and graduate students with demonstrated academic ability. The After School Education and Safety (ASES) Program Act of 2002, an initiative statute approved by the voters as Proposition 49 at the November 5, 2002, statewide general election, established the ASES Program under which participating public schools receive grants to operate before and after school programs serving pupils in kindergarten or grades 1 to 9. The California State Legislature has proposed AB 1725, which would amend Proposition 49 by requiring the Department of Finance to augment the total funding amount for the program through an increase in the daily per-pupil rate equal to the higher of either 50% of specified increases to the minimum wage or the percentage increase to the California Consumer Price Index. Given that Rio Hondo College values continued availability of after school programs to all youth in the district, the Board is asked to consider supporting a resolution in support of AB 1725.

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING AB 1725: INCREASED FUNDING FOR AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMS RESOLUTION #061219-2

WHEREAS, in 2002, voters approved Proposition 49 which provides a continuous appropriation of over \$550 million annually to provide students in low-income communities access to safe, enriching after-school programs that offer academic assistance, enrichment activities, and recreational activities; the implementation of the ballot measure began in 2006 with the After School Education and Safety Program (Program); and

WHEREAS, on average, schools participating in the Program have more than 80% of their student population eligible for free and reduced price meals; and

WHEREAS, the Program provides funding for over 4,000 elementary and middle schools throughout the State and serves more than 400,000 students daily; and

WHEREAS, research shows that participation in the Program improves school attendance, reduces dropout rates, helps English learners transition to proficiency, develops Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts and Mathematics learning; and

WHEREAS, such programs enrich workforce skills, build social-emotional skills, improve health and nutrition, prevent and reduce youth substance use and abuse, and reduce crime involving youth; and

WHEREAS, working parents rely on safe and effective after-school programs to enable them to work additional hours to support their families, while children depend on these programs to obtain valuable skills during a high crime period of the day; and

WHEREAS, the State's per capita investment in the Program has declined since 2006, despite substantial increases to the costs of operating these programs; and

WHEREAS, as costs have significantly outpaced dedicated funding, ASES programs have been forced to reduce the essential academic supports and enrichment opportunities they provide to pupils; and nearly one-quarter of ASES programs are likely to close their doors by 2020 unless they receive additional funding; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature is currently considering AB 1725 (Carrillo) and the corresponding budget request, which would appropriate additional funds for the Program; and

WHEREAS, AB 1725 and the additional appropriation for the Program would ensure that children statewide will have an opportunity to enroll in the Program and will also increase educational outcomes for students;






All Staff by Ethnicity 2015 – 2019




All Staff by Gender 2015 – 2019



Administration by Ethnicity 2015 – 2019




Administration by Gender 2015 - 2019


Confidential Staff by Ethnicity 2015 - 2019








Classified Staff by Ethnicity 2015 – 2019




Classified Staff by Gender 2015 - 2019








Hispanic Full-Time Instructional Faculty Statewide














Part-Time Faculty by Ethnicity 2015 – 2019




Part-Time Faculty by Gender 2015 - 2019



Hispanic Adjunct Instructional Faculty Statewide







4. BP 2410 - Board Policies and Administrative Procedures

Board Policy

BOARD POLICIES AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES

BP No. 2410

Board Adopted: 3/13/02;11/12/03; 10/9/13; 1/13/16; 7/12/17

Page 1 of 2

- I. The Board of Trustees may adopt such policies as are authorized by law or determined by the Board to be necessary for the efficient operation of the District. Board policies are intended to be statements of intent by the Board on a specific issue within its subject matter jurisdiction. The policies have been written to be consistent with provisions of law, but do not encompass all laws relating to District activities. All District employees are expected to know of and observe all provisions of law pertinent to their job responsibilities.
- II. Policies of the Board may be adopted, revised, added to, or amended at any regular Board meeting by a majority vote; however, they shall not be included in the Consent Agenda. Proposed changes or additions shall be introduced not less than one regular meeting prior to the meeting at which action is recommended and should undergo the review process outlined in Administrative Procedure 2410 unless the Board finds there are special circumstances. The Board shall regularly assess its policies for effectiveness in fulfilling the District's mission.
- III. Administrative procedures are to be issued by the Superintendent/President as statements of method to be used in implementing Board Policy. Such administrative procedures shall be consistent with the intent of Board Policies. Administrative procedures may be revised as deemed necessary by the Superintendent/President after undergoing the review process outlined in Administrative Procedure 2410.
- IV. The Board will regularly review and evaluate Board policies to ensure that they are consistent with the mission of the College and are in compliance with requirements established by appropriate external agencies. In addition, policies will be evaluated for their effectiveness as measured by specific outcomes, and clarity of language and intent. The process for review is delineated in Administrative Procedure 2410. All constituent groups (administrators, faculty, staff, and students) shall be provided the opportunity to participate effectively in the formulation and development of District policies and procedures. Proposed changes to Board policies and new Board policies shall be reviewed by the President's Cabinet, President's Council, Administrative Council, and Planning and Fiscal Council, for input before adoption. Should the Board wish to revise a Board policy, an amended version will go through the review process and should return to the Board within three (3) months. For Board policies related to academic and professional matters as defined by Title V, Section 53200, the Board will consult collegially with the Academic Senate.
- V. The Superintendent/President shall provide each member of the Board with copies of administrative procedures and advise the Board of any revisions as they are established. The Board reserves the right to direct revisions of the administrative procedures should they, in the Board's judgment, be inconsistent with the Board's own policies. Copies of all policies and administrative procedures shall be readily available through the Superintendent/President's Office, the College website, and the campus library.

- I. The Board is committed to promoting and maintaining a District work and learning environment that is safe and free of threatening, disruptive or violent behavior. The Board's priority is the prompt and effective handling of threatening, disruptive or violent incidents in the workplace, including bullying, intimidation, stalking, threats of violence, or actual violence that may seriously interfere with the orderly operation of the workplace.
- II. The Superintendent/President shall establish administrative procedures that assure that individuals are informed regarding what actions will be considered threatening, disruptive or violent behavior in the workplace. The administrative procedures shall include definitions and procedures for reporting and responding to reports.
- III. This policy applies to all employees, students, and visitors on all Rio Hondo Community College District campuses.

I. Purpose

Rio Hondo Community College District ("District") is committed to providing and maintaining a safe work and learning environment.

The purpose of this Administrative Procedure is to provide a means to quickly address behavior that is disruptive of or threatens the safety of the workplace.

II. Definitions

Workplace violence includes, but is not limited to: bullying, intimidation, stalking, threats, unwanted physical contact, property damage, physical attack, or violent behavior. This includes acts of violence committed by or against district employees. Such incidents may also involve students, visitors or vendors.

The following definitions are provided to assist individuals in identifying disruptive or violent behavior that should be reported to allow the District to promptly address such behavior.

- A. Disruptive Behavior consists of persistent, intentional behavior or conduct, whether in person, in writing, by telephone, or by other electronic means, that may seriously disturb, interfere with or prevent normal work functions or activities of the workplace, including, but not limited to, the following:
 - 1. Bullying unwanted offensive or malicious behavior which includes an element of vindictiveness, and is intended to undermine, patronize, humiliate, intimidate or demean the recipient through persistently negative attacks. Examples include but not limited to: yelling, using profanity, waving arms or fists, verbally abusing others, derogatory remarks, insults, and epithets.
 - a. In cases of reported bullying, a subcommittee will be formed composed of the District's Title IX officer, and a CSEA designee, RHCFA designee, and administrative designee, all of whom must be trained in Title IX requirements, to determine whether the action meets the definition of bullying. The Title IX Officer serves as a resource (non-voting member.)
 - Intimidation unwarranted behavior intended to frighten, coerce, or induce duress. Examples include but not limited to: making statements which are false, malicious, disparaging, derogatory, rude, disrespectful, abusive, or which have the intent to hurt others' reputations.
 - a. In cases of alleged intimidation, a subcommittee will be formed composed of the District's Title IX officer, and a CSEA designee, RHCFA designee, and administrative designee, all of whom must be trained in Title IX requirements to determine whether the action meets the definition of intimidation.
 - 3. Stalking behavior involving harassing or pestering an individual, in person, in writing, by telephone or by electronic format, including following, spying on,

alarming the individual, or causing them distress, which may involve physical violence or the fear of physical violence.

- 4. Threat expression of intent to cause physical or mental harm, which may be direct, indirect, conditional, or contingent, regardless of whether the individual has the present ability to carry out the threat.
- B. Violent Behavior consists of behavior or attempted behavior of a violent nature in the workplace including, but not limited to, the following:
 - Unwanted Physical Contact behavior such as grabbing, hitting, kicking, pushing, tripping, shoving, throwing objects, or the use of a weapon against an individual, or any other conduct or attempted conduct of a person that endangers the physical health or physical safety of an employee.
 - 2. Property Damage behavior that intentionally damages an individual's work area, an individual's property, or other District property.
 - 3. Threat of Violent Behavior expression of intent to engage in unwanted physical contact (e.g., moving closer aggressively), or property damage including a threatening statement or threatening behavior that gives an individual reasonable cause to believe that the individual is at risk of injury. Examples include, but not limited to: "You better watch your back" or "I'll get you" as well as implicit threats "you'll be sorry" or "this isn't over". A threat of violent behavior also includes bringing a firearm, knife or other weapon of any kind onto campus property, unless such possession or use is a job requirement.
 - 4. Physical attack unwanted or hostile physical contact including but not limited to hitting, fighting, shoving, restraining, or throwing objects.
 - 5. Violent behavior any physical assault, with or without weapons; behavior that a reasonable person would interpret as being potentially violent [e.g., throwing things, pounding on a desk or door, or destroying property].

IV. Procedure.

A. Roles.

- All persons on campus are expected to respect the rights and welfare of others in the workplace and on District property. Individuals who experience or witness Disruptive Behavior or Violent Behavior are encouraged to report such behavior pursuant to this Administrative Procedure.
- Supervisors are responsible for training and implementing sound practices to ensure a safe and secure workplace, and shall implement appropriate corrective action in accordance with applicable District policies and procedures.

3. All supervisors and managers have a mandatory duty to report violent and disruptive behavior.

B. Reporting

- Emergency Violent or Disruptive behavior that is of a criminal nature that requires immediate intervention and/or assistance from police, fire or medical personnel shall be reported by calling 911.
- 2. Non-Emergency Violent or Disruptive behavior that is not an emergency shall be reported to any of the following:
 - The supervisor or appropriate department head
 - Human Resources Department
 - Dean of Student Affairs/Compliance Officer
 - Campus Security

An employee should normally report violent or disruptive behavior to the employee's supervisor or appropriate department head. If the employee (complainant) is uncomfortable doing so, due to extenuating circumstances or a conflict of interest, the employee may report the violent or disruptive behavior to any of the above. A conflict of interest may exist when the accused is the complainant's supervisor/department head, which may directly influence the accused's own interests or interests treated as the accused's own (perceived or actual), such as interests relating to the accused's spouse or friend, or personal gain

- C. No person who in good faith initiates a complaint or reports an incident under this policy shall be subject to retaliation or harassment.
- D. Restraining Orders/Court Orders: An employee shall notify the District of any restraining orders/court orders when named as a plaintiff, and provide a copy of the order to the Compliance Officer, Room SS-204. In the event the supervisor is informed by an employee of a restraining order, the supervisor will contact the Compliance Officer, ensure he/she is aware of it, and that he/she has a copy of the restraining order on file.

E. Prohibition On Retaliation

 All employees are encouraged to be alert to the possibility of violence on the part of employees, former employees, students, visitors or vendors and shall report all acts of violence and threats of violence to the employee's supervisor or appropriate department head as provided in this procedure.

2. This procedure prohibits retaliation against any employee who, in good faith, reports a violation of this policy. All reports of violence will be handled in a confidential manner, with information released on a need-to-know basis. District supervisors and administrators shall be sensitive and responsive to fears from the reporting employee of reprisal.

F. District's Response

- 1. Disruptive Behavior: The District supervisor, appropriate department head or Compliance Officer shall take appropriate action to promptly investigate and review the factual information gathered to determine the validity of the complaint and/or the extent and nature of the problem, and, if the report is substantiated after investigation, the District supervisor, appropriate department head, or Compliance Officer shall take reasonable steps to ensure that the disruptive behavior in the workplace stops by undertaking efforts to address the behavior by, including but not limited to: mediation, rearrangement of work/academic schedules; reassignment; obtaining apologies; providing informal counseling and/or training, etc. and shall report the behavior to the Director of Human Resources or appropriate official.
- Violent Behavior: Any supervisor, department head or other District official who receives a report of alleged Violent Behavior shall call Campus Security or 911 immediately.
- 3. If Violent or Disruptive Behavior occurred in violation of BP 3510 or this procedure, the District shall take disciplinary action against the accused and any other remedial action it determines to be appropriate. Disciplinary actions against faculty, staff and students will conform to all relevant statues, regulations, personnel policies and procedures, including the provisions of any applicable collective bargaining agreement.
- 4. The District shall also take reasonable steps to protect the complainant from further Violent or Disruptive Behavior, and to protect the complainant and witnesses from retaliation as a result of communicating the complaint and/or assisting in the investigation.
- 5. The District will make efforts to protect victims of workplace violence by offering all feasible security measures. Victims may also need support, special accommodations or adjustments to their work schedule, work location or working conditions in order to enhance their safety. The District will accommodate these requests and needs whenever possible and appropriate.

G. Education and Prevention

The District shall provide education and prevention information about workplace violence and disruption to all of its employees, which shall include: diversity and cultural awareness in the workplace, conflict resolution,

definitions of violent and disruptive behaviors, preventative steps to maintain a safe workplace, identifying problem behavior, how to respond to violent or disruptive behavior, reporting protocol, and record keeping. This information shall be disseminated to all employees and posted on the college website. Targeted on-going training will be provided to those employees responsible for responding to workplace violence incidents.
