I. Update on TK20 and SLOlutions

Adam reported that we are planning to move to TK20 in the fall of 2017 and that he will be developing an implementation plan to bring to the SLO Committee.

II. Update on missing assessment reports

There are still many missing assessment reports and Adam is working the JoAnna to get them all in. This process must be completed by mid-March in order to provide information to the ACCJC for the annual report. It is expected that we will have the same or higher percentage of classes with assessment reports completed as last year.

III. SLO Symposium

Shelly, Barbara, Howard, and Adam reported that the SLO Symposium put on by the ASCCC in early February was very useful. They discussed how other schools have much more refined processes and that Rio Hondo might draw on the processes from them in the future. There were presentations on how colleges are disaggregating data, something that Rio Hondo will also incorporate in the future as described below.

IV. Pilot for disaggregating SLOs by student

Adam proposed that a pilot program be developed for disaggregating outcomes by students. The SLO Committee agreed that Adam should outline a program and bring it back to the committee for review. This will also be useful since it may tie in with the needs of other areas of the college such as Student Equity, SSSP, and others.

V. Developing SLO hierarchies

Adam described how schools have developed nested outcomes whereby faculty enter data for their courses and this populates into program, general education, and institutional level outcomes. This serves as a good template for how we can move forward once the change to TK20 occurs. Adam will bring an example to the March meeting.

VI. April meeting conflict

Adam has a conflict with the April meeting date. Therefore, the SLO Committee proposed that SLO workshops should be given in April in lieu of a meeting.
