Registration and Financial Resources

Admissions and Records

The Admissions and Records office is the first point of contact for all students entering Río Hondo College. This office helps students from the application process to graduation as it pertains to a student's academic record. This includes: application for admission; California residency issues; registration; enrollment and degree verifications; transcripts; evaluation of external transcripts; grades from faculty; course repetitions; pass/no pass grading option; evaluation of degree and certificate eligibility; and processing student ID cards and Transit Access Passes.



Student Health and Psychological Services

The Student Health and Psychological Services helps students with health and mental health needs. They are committed to supporting students' academic success and personal development with short-term counseling for those who are struggling with issues such as stress. anxiety, anger, depression and grief. A desire to heal from trauma, to build healthy relationships, to consider one's gender and sexuality, to manage life's transitions and to face "adulting" challenges are some of the topics that Río students discuss confidentially with therapists in individual and group sessions. The Health Center provides a variety of services including TB tests, flu shots, vision tests, pregnancy test, sick room available, over the counter medications for minor illnesses and many others.
