



## HOW TO CITE OPEN EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES (OER) ON A COURSE OUTLINE OF RECORD (COR)

The following guidelines are for faculty members who would like to incorporate open educational resources (OER) into their course outline of record (COR).

### To Cite Specific OER on a COR

Here is the format for citing OER on a COR properly. Please note that not all OER will have an International Standardized Book Number (ISBN). If the OER does not have an ISBN, simply leave this box blank in *CurriQūnet*.

Author (last name first). *Title*. Edition or Version (if beyond first). Publisher, Publication year or Revision Date. ISBN, URL. License.

So, for example:

Dillon, Dave. *Blueprint for Success in College and Career*. Version 1.3. Rebus Community, 2018. ISBN 9781989014042, <https://press.rebus.community/blueprint2>. Licensed under CC BY 4.0.

### To Cite the Use of OER in General on a COR

Here is an example of how to cite the intention to use (non-specific) OER on a COR in place of commercial textbooks:

##### Textbooks

- Stable and published open educational resources equivalent to the commercial textbooks listed here, or:
- [Commercial textbooks here]
