



Study abroad in London

PROGRAM INCLUDES:

- Accommodation in a homestay in residential zones 3 or 4. Homestays include twin-room accommodation, continental breakfast daily, access to a shared kitchen. One load of laundry per week.
- For a supplement of \$2995, students can choose to live in a supervised student residence in double rooms with shared bathrooms, shared kitchen and living room. The private apartment is fully furnished and the kitchen includes a washing machine and dishwasher. No meals are included.
- London Transport travel pass, for use on the buses and underground trains in travel zones 1 and 2 (for students in student residence) and zones 1, 2, 3 or 4 (for students in homestays).
- An orientation program in London consisting of a meeting with experienced AIFS staff, covering topics such as general acclimation to London/UK, safety and security issues, cultural differences, travel, money and cultural activities. Workshops with local staff about life in site and the differences the students will encounter.
- Local area walking tour covering housing and classroom location and local amenities.
- A half-day sightseeing tour of London by private bus with the services of a professional, English-speaking guide.
- Access to the wireless-enabled AIFS Student Center and computer lab and the services of AIFS' Student Advisors for information, personal advising/counseling and 24-hour emergency contact service.
- Weekly cultural program of heavily subsidized extra-curricular activities including day trips, walking tours, theatre and sporting events. A farewell event.
- A British Life and Culture Course on historical, political, economic, and cultural aspects of contemporary Britain, including 12 weekly lectures, 4 local field trips and a student activity plan.
- Students will have special membership to the Imperial College Student Union to join the over 370 clubs, activities or societies or participate in sports activities (some with additional fees). The campus has a gym & pool (for additional fees at the student rate) as well as shops, pubs & cafés.
- Medical Insurance.

FEES

Based on an enrollment of 45 or more participants, the fee per person is **\$9,345**. This fee excludes airfare, optional insurance upgrade, passport or visa fees, meals other than those listed, personal expenses, any Citrus College tuition or administrative fees, textbooks, additional field trips or excursions required by the Citrus college faculty and anything not specified.

OPTIONAL TRANSPORTATION PACKAGE

An optional Transportation Package is available, consisting of round-trip airfare between Los Angeles and London Heathrow, and round-trip transfers overseas between the airport in London and student housing for an additional \$tbc. Mandatory additional U.S. government- and airline-imposed departure taxes, fees and fuel surcharges of \$tbc* will be billed separately. (Total \$tbc*) (*subject to change until ticketed.)

OPTIONAL EXCURSION TO SCOTLAND \$795

A 4-day, 3-night excursion to Edinburg, Loch Ness and Isle of Skye, including round-trip train travel, hostel accommodation in multi-bedded rooms with daily breakfast, a 3-day guided bus tour to the Highlands and Islands of Scotland, evening meals, a group meal, the services of AIFS staff throughout.
